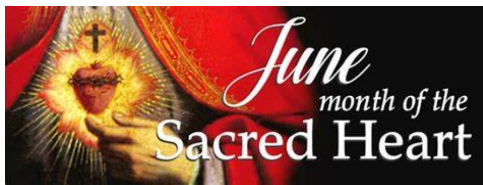

PASTOR'S CORNER

10th Sunday in Ordinary Time — The Promised One

In today's Gospel, Jesus has just been healing and casting out demons in Galilee. Along with the crowds who flock to Him so that He is not even able to take time to eat, come people who do not understand what He is doing. Even His friends think ['He is beside Himself'] and needs to be taken away for a while. But the scribes who came down from Jerusalem are not just honestly mistaken; they accuse Him of being possessed by the prince of demons.

The reality is just the opposite. Jesus is revealing Himself as the one promised in our First Reading. He is the seed of the woman who has come to crush the head of the demonic serpent. In the parable of the strong man, Jesus reveals that He has come not just to punish the devil but to free those bound by him. As St. Bede explains, "The Lord has also bound the strong man, that is, the devil: which means, He has restrained him from seducing the elect, and entering into his house, the world; He has spoiled his house, and His goods, that is men, because He has snatched them from the snares of the devil, and has united them to His Church."

The scribes blaspheme by attributing this work of the Holy Spirit to demons. Jesus adds a statement that shocks us at first: "whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit never has forgiveness." That does not mean that there are any limits to the mercy of God (CCC 1864). Rather, the only sin that cannot be forgiven is the deliberate refusal to accept the mercy offered through the Holy Spirit.

Instead, we must imitate those who sat at Jesus' feet. For, as He said, "Whoever does the will of God is my brother, and sister, and mother."

2024 PARISH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Year in review 2023

THIS Wednesday, JUNE 12 at 7PM

Holy Redeemer's Parish Pastoral Council is proposing the following amendments to the Parish Constitution.

We will vote on these changes at our Annual General Meeting on Wednesday, June 12. For a further explanation of these amendments, please view the document at <https://www.holyredeemer.ca/constitution>, or in the parish office.

1) **To RELOCATE** the following sentence:

"Notice of the AGM shall be given in the bulletin and in the announcements six weeks prior to the meeting, ensuring adequate time for the parishioners to prepare for the Council elections."

FROM the section entitled "The Pastoral and the Finance Councils" **TO the section** entitled "Annual General Meeting".

2(a) **To ADD a new section** entitled "The Pastoral Council and the Parish Leadership Team" **AFTER the section** entitled "The Pastoral and the Finance Councils", with text which reads:

"At the discretion of the Pastor, a Parish Leadership Team (PLT) can be formed by the Pastor to assist in his leadership of the parish and to support his role as Pastor."

2(b) **To ADD an Appendix** describing the Parish Leadership Team, with text as follows:

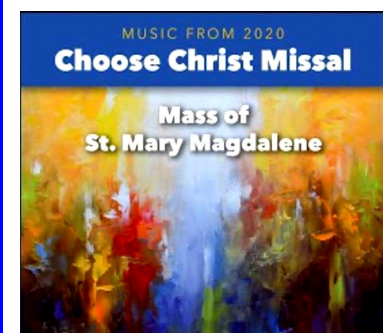
"The Parish Leadership Team plays a crucial role in helping the Pastor align the parish to the missionary call of the Church and in defining the priorities of the parish through prayer and discernment of the direction of the Holy Spirit. It would be a daunting role for a Pastor to do this alone with the pressure to be "everything for everyone". With the ongoing support of a leadership team, the Pastor can concentrate on using the gifts that God has given him to build the kingdom while the team members can assist in areas that the Pastor needs support.

This team operates differently from the Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Council and staff through meeting frequently to pray, discern, support the Pastor, problem solve, ensure alignment with objectives and to monitor action items. As well, the team meets at other times to discern strategic short and mid-term priorities including a joint meeting with the PLT and the Executive of the PPC to create Thematic Goals/Rallying Cries."

3) **To MODIFY the Terms of Service** in of an ordinary member of the Parish Pastoral Council in the section entitled "Conditions of Service for Council Members",

FROM: "The term of office of an ordinary member is two years. An ordinary member may not be elected for more than three consecutive terms."

TO: "The term of office of an ordinary member is three years. Such a member may not serve for more than one consecutive term."



AS WE RETURN TO ORDINARY TIME ... we will be using a new Mass setting called the '*Mass of St. Mary Magdalene*'.

Together, the choirs chose this selection of music because it is beautiful, singable, and reverent. It will be our Mass setting used during Ordinary Time each year (*following Pentecost until Christ the King, then again following the Christmas season until the beginning of Lent*) for the foreseeable future.
