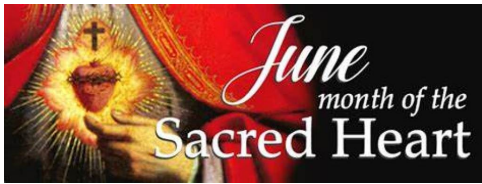

In today's Gospel, Jesus uses the imagery of seeds to give us an idea of how the Kingdom of God is to mature and grow. As Christians, we are called to be part of His Kingdom; to build and sustain it by our acts of faith, hope and charity.

Speaking in Parables

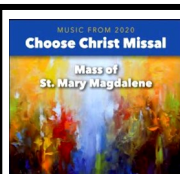

In April of this year, the Dicastery for Doctrine of the Faith released "*Dignitas Infinita*" (Infinite Dignity) that highlights the indispensable nature of the dignity of the human person. A healthy understanding of human dignity is at the heart of a Catholic Christian anthropology and at the foundation of Catholic social teaching.

"Those who are committed to defending human dignity can find in the Christian faith the deepest reasons for this commitment. How wonderful is the certainty that each human life is not adrift in the midst of hopeless chaos, in a world ruled by pure chance or endlessly recurring cycles!

The Creator can say to each one of us: "Before I formed you in the womb, I knew you" (Jer 1:5). We were conceived in the heart of God, and for this reason "each of us is the result of a thought of God. Each of us is willed, each of us is loved, each of us is necessary" (from *Laudato Si* §65).
